Legislative Intent:

The Hamilton County Board of Supervisors, by Local Law No. 1 of 1979 for the purposes of electing Coroners, divided the County into three districts: District No. 1 included the Towns of Indian Lake, Long Lake and Inlet; District No. 2 included the Towns of Lake Pleasant, Arietta, and Morehouse; and District No. 3 included the Towns of Wells, Hope and Benson. District No. 1 encompasses too large a territory for one person to cover conveniently.

SECTION 1. That Hamilton County for the purposes of electing Coroners shall be divided into four districts as follows: District No. 1 - Towns of Indian Lake and Inlet; District No. 2 - Towns of Lake Pleasant, Arietta, and Morehouse; and District No. 3 - Towns of Wells, Hope and Benson; District No. 4 - Town of Long Lake.

SECTION 2. That one Coroner shall be elected in each of said districts at the general election. The Coroners duly elected in Districts Nos. 2 and 3 will complete their terms of office as duly elected. That one Coroner shall be elected in District No. 1 and District No. 4 at the general election to be held in the year this Local Law becomes effective. The term of office shall be three years from and including the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January next succeeding his election.

SECTION 3. The term of office of the Coroner elected in District No. 1 and holding office in the County at the time this law becomes effective shall expire on December 31<sup>st</sup>, 1997.

SECTION 4. This Local Law if subject to a permissive referendum as provided in Subdivision 3 of Section 400 of the County Law of the State of New York.

SECTION 5. This Local Law shall take effect forty five days after its adoption unless a petition protesting against such Local Law is filed with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors and signed by qualified electors as required by law.
