Legislative Intent: The Hamilton County Personnel Officer's annual salary for the year 2000 was set by the Hamilton County Board of Supervisors at Twenty Six Thousand Ten Dollars (\$26,010.00). That to bring the Hamilton County Personnel Officer's annual salary into conformity with the other appointed officials, the annual salary for the Hamilton County Personnel Officer for the year 2001 will be Twenty Eight Thousand Six Hundred Eleven Dollars (\$28,611.00).

BE IT ENACTED, by the Hamilton County Board of Supervisors as follows:

1. That the Hamilton County Board of Supervisors hereby fixes the Hamilton County Personnel Officer's annual salary for the year 2001 at be Twenty Eight Thousand Six Hundred Eleven Dollars (\$28,611.00).

2. Insofar as the provisions of this local law are inconsistent with the provisions of other local laws or acts, the provisions of this local law shall be controlling.

3. This local law is subject to a referendum on petition and shall take effect forty five (45) days after its adoption unless a petition protesting against such local law is filed with the Clerk and signed by qualified electors as required.
